In 1990, Jim opened Jim Cox Adventures, which is still open today. He is constantly teach archery through community outreach in the schools, special needs youth and adult programs, 4H groups, Boys/Girls/Cub Scouts, corporate groups, evening leagues & special private events.

Jim had hunted both Catalina and Santa Cruz Islands over 50 times each, before they closed to hunting.
