

Legislative Team Update

Hello CBH friends and family! The CBH/SAA Legislative Team has another exciting update for you this month starting with the Fish and Game Commission's (FGC) **denial** of the Humane Society of the US (HSUS) Petition 2021-027 to Ban Bear Hunting!

CBH response to the petition over the last several months included sending letters of opposition to the FGC and California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) in partnership with dozens of other conservation organizations. These letters meticulously refuted the erroneous and misleading claims made by the HSUS regarding the health and status of California's bear population. We know that the criteria FGC uses to make decisions and act on these petitions is grounded in science. Therefore, the cores of our statements were backed by references and summaries of current peer reviewed scientific literature related to bear studies in California.

Heading into the FGC meeting on April 21, we reviewed a six-page letter by Commission Staff and an 11-page letter by CDFW, both of which recommended that the Commission deny the petition on the basis that the "best available science" indicates that there has been "no significant reduction in bear abundances." Per CDFW, "multiple lines of evidence point to an abundant and stable black bear population. Hunting affects only a small fraction of that population and serves as a management tool to provide key population monitoring data that cannot be easily obtained otherwise."

Although the Commission Staff and CDFW recommendations were a positive indicator of how the Commissioners may vote, we didn't let our guard down and proceeded with plans to provide verbal testimony at the FGC meeting.

On April 18, Patrick Brannon (CDFW Region 4 Legislative Rep) and J-Barr (CBH Small Game Committee Chairman) attended a preparatory call hosted by the grassroots organization HOWL for Wildlife (https://www.howlforwildlife.org/). HOWL explained how the public may participate in the FGC meeting and shared dozens of one-minute testimonials highlighting different aspects of why the Commission should deny the petition.

Similarly, on April 20, the CBH Legislative Team held our own strategy meeting and crafted key elements of our

testimony. Robert Moore was a wealth of information and history and in a great show of collaboration, everyone was able to chime in with their thoughts and perspective. Thank you, Robert, Chriss Bowles (CBH/SAA President), Patrick Brannon, Wayne Raupe (CBH/SAA Past president), J-Barr, James Galliver (CDFW Region 5 Legislative Rep), Brad Belvedere (CDFW Region 3 Legislative Rep), and Teri Faulkner (CDFW Region 1 Legislative Rep) for your input and support!

Knowing that the FGC meeting would run long and that no one knew when the Commission would arrive at this agenda item, we set up a group text message so that the team could track the meeting progress and alert one another when the time approached! Several of us monitored the meeting from 8:30am until 4pm when our turn finally arrived!

The public comment period was preceded by a short presentation by CDFW on the current bear population models, updated modeling in progress, and a summary of multiple independent studies all concluding a healthy and stable bear population in California. Each speaker was then given 1 minute to testify in support or opposition to the petition. Cont. on page 7

Legislative Team Update from page 4- Over TWO HOURS of public testimony followed!

Our lobbyist Bill Gaines attended the FGC meeting in person in Monterey, CA and provided verbal comments on behalf of the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC), including CBH/SAA. He was also quick on the spot when the Commissioners had follow-up questions regarding HSUS definition of "trophy hunting" in which they stated that the primary motivation for bear hunting was the fur and photo opportunity, not meat. Bill explained that hunters use every part of the harvested animal and that not to take and use the meat would be illegal under "wanton waste" regulations.

Four members of CBH also provided verbal comments on the FGC meeting via Zoom – Amanda Duchardt, James Galliver, J-Barr and Patrick Brannon.

Speaking thoughtfully, clearly, and concisely to the Commissioners and hundreds of listeners while a one-minute timer stares you down is COMPLETELY nerveracking, especially since there is NO warning before they call your name! A couple of us were surprised when our name was called and had to dive back to our phones and scramble for our notes and the unmute button.

Patrick even braved a tornado warning and battled technical issues before he got to speak!

Legislative Team Update from page 7- Throughout the meeting, we supported, cheered, and congratulated each other on our efforts and the courage to speak up. I'm very proud of all our team and this was a GREAT team effort!

In total, **74** individuals spoke out urging the Commission to deny the petition versus 25 individuals speaking in favor of banning bear hunting. When the votes were cast, the Commission denied the petition and we won the day.

I especially appreciated FGC President Samantha Murray's comments ahead of her vote to deny the petition. In summary, she stated that:

- Hunting is legal in CA
- Quoted FGC's mission statement: "We embrace our responsibility to, among other things, secure a rich and sustainable outdoor heritage for all generations to experience and enjoy though consumptive and nonconsumptive activities and that does include hunting."
- She "believes in hunting" as a natural way to eat meat, connect people with nature, and cultivate a healthy respect and love for the outdoors.
- Just because 99% of people don't do something (hunting and fishing) doesn't mean that no one should... that's not what democracy means. There needs to be a compelling reason to do so, such as when people, habitat, or wildlife are at risk or when it will bring a significant benefit to the species.
- Hunting affects a small fraction of the black bear population, and it serves as a management tool and provides data.
- Black bears are public resources and FGC's job is to manage them in support of healthy populations into the future. When hunting opportunities need to be limited, the FGC prohibits take.
- The science does not warrant limiting bear hunting opportunities.

In his final comments, CDFW Director Chuck Bonham committed to providing regular updates on the Bear Management Plan in the Wildlife Resource Committee meetings and estimated that the updated plan would be available in about a year!

Not to be completely overshadowed by the HSUS petition, the FGC also acted to refer the following petitions to the CDFW for review and recommendation.

Petition 2022-01 (Benicia Waterfowl Hunting): Request to prohibit waterfowl hunting in specific areas along the shoreline near Benicia and Southhampton Bay and Petition 2022-02 (Traditional Deer Tag): Request to create a new class of deer hunting tags restricted to method of take such as traditional archery and muzzleloading shotgun and rifle. CBH/SAA spoke in favor of denying Petition 2022-01 and with some reservation, supported referring Petition 2022-02 to the CDFW. Other Legislative Team actions and updates this month:

- Signed a coalition letter of support for AB 2344 Wildlife Connectivity: Transportation Projects, which would improve the health of our deer, elk, wild sheep, and other wildlife by requiring the CDFW to coordinate with Caltrans on identifying areas essential to wildlife movement and habitat connectivity and developing a wildlife connectivity action plan and list of priority wildlife passage projects to reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions and enhance wildlife connectivity.
- Signed a coalition letter of support to the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) for Wild Horse/Burro **Roundup.** Before signing onto this letter, the CBH/ SAA Legislative Team ensured that these activities were consistent with our values. We recognized that wild horses and burros are non-native species that have a destructive effect on native habitats, and subsequently on our native species and game animals. Therefore, they require management. However, several of our members expressed questions and concerns about the methods of roundup and management that BLM would employ in the roundup. As hunters, we practice ethical management of game animals through fair chase and we avoid wanton waste. We reviewed BLM management techniques and determined that they are consistent with our values. We reviewed a coalition letter of opposition to AB 1901 Dog Training Services and Facilities but missed the deadline to respond. The author of AB 1901 has agreed to amend the bill in response to opposition from our partners in the CHCC and sent Gaines and Associates some draft amendments. Per Bill Gaines, the bill is much better, but we are still working some minor final tweaks. CBH/SAA will be added to any further letters on that bill, if they're necessary.

- We also reviewed a coalition letter of support for SB 1244 Department of Fish and Wildlife: Public Resources Account, which, as amended March 16, 2022, would expressly require that certain Cigarette Tax "waterfowl" funding be allocated directly to DFW for programs which protect, restore, enhance, and/or maintain waterfowl habitats. The funding amounts to approximately \$1.1 M annually. However, California Waterfowl Association (CWA) finalized the letter earlier than expected but committed to CBH/SAA and two additional NGOs to the letter when the bill goes to Senate Appropriations Committee.
- Signed a coalition letter of support for AB 1753 Fish and Wildlife: Poaching: Probation Periods legislation which would reinstate a maximum 3-year probation for four serious violations of the Fish and Game Code including: 1) Section 12012 The illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain, 2) Section 12013 The illegal take or possession in the field of more than three times the daily bag limit, 3) Section 12013.3 The illegal take of trophy deer, elk, antelope, bighorn sheep or wild turkey, and 4) Section 12002.3(b) The illegal sale or purchase of abalone. AB 1753 has been referred to the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee but has not been set to be heard.
- Update on SB 865 Junior Hunting License: SB 865 passed out of Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee the week of March 7. Next SB 865 was heard by the Senate Appropriations Committee where it was placed in the suspense file for consideration a later date due to their possible fiscal impact to the state. It MUST be pulled from the suspense heard and passed out of Senate Appropriations Committee and to the Senate Floor by May 20th. This bill will increase the eligibility age of junior hunters from 15 to 17 in an effort to influence youth and retain adult hunters. CBH/SAA previously signed a coalition letter of support for this bill.
- Update on SB 915 Firearms (State Property): SB 915
 passed out of Senate Natural Resources and Water
 Committee week of March 7. Next, it was head by the

Senate Appropriations Committee and was placed in the suspense file for consideration a later date due to SB 915 must be pulled from the suspense heard and passed out of Senate Appropriations Committee and to the Senate Floor by May 20th. This bill would prohibit the sale of any firearm, firearm part or ammunition on state property. CBH/SAA previously signed a coalition letter of opposition to this bill.

Update on SB 906 Firearms (School Disclosure):
 SB 906 failed to pass out of the Senate Education
 Committee on a 2-2 vote, with 3 members not
 voting. The author, Senator Anthony J. Portantino
 (D/25-Glendale), did request, and was granted,
 "reconsideration" – meaning that the bill could be
 brought up for another vote at a later date. CBH/
 SAA will continue to monitor this bill.


This bill is largely duplicative of existing gun ownership regulations and requirements and represents a gross invasion of privacy with the potential to negatively impact children's educational opportunities, gun ownership, hunting, and funding for conservation. CBH/SAA previously signed a coalition letter of opposition to this bill.

- Update on SB 945 Falconry. SB 945 passed out of Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee via a unanimous 8-0 vote. SB 945 will next be heard in the Senate Appropriations Committee later this spring. This bill would allow falconers to again have access to the peregrine falcon for use in falconry for the first time in 50 years! CBH/SAA previously signed a coalition letter of support for this bill.

filming Your adventures

About the time you are reading through this, my partner Ron Crouch and I will be in Berrien Springs. Michigan. Bent Bow Productions Youtube LINK will be conducting a seminar for Compton's Traditional Bowhunters at their 2022 Rendezvous. This will be the outline form we are following so don't expect the dialog type reading you may have become accustom to reading here. On the other hand, here you have the details in writing to refer to should you choose to take the leap and get started - or dive deeper into another hobby you have developed a passion for. When I say passion; that is exactly what filming my adventures have become. This obsession is so deeply rooted it often consumes hunting time. The payoffs for me (and others) are so numerous they can not be named within these confines. Let's get started.

Memories:

Look in the garage, on the wall, at a photograph, a buddies recount - ALL can elicit smells, imagery, wind direction, weather, the terrain, exhibiting a small piece of understanding of creation - this and much more - filming these times stretches forth the amount of enjoyment of those times spent.

WILL it make you a better hunter:

Improve your situational awareness and knowledge of game Patience - Stalking you have to develop skill sets to out think not only your quarry but anticipate where your partner will be and when they are about to shoot. Try to be just off the right or left approximately 5-10 yards back angling toward the intended game.

Filming Your Adventures From page 10 **How to Start Your Project**:

Catch your Eye? - Start videoing:

Objective: Share the entire story (so much more than the kill). Capture the mood of the hunt: the weather, terrain, and adversities.

You will need tons of "B Roll" or "support footage" to involve the viewer in the journey. Film continuously; daily: much easier than trying to "catch-up" or go back. Otherwise all too often it doesn't get done.

Foundational Practices:

Learn your camera - Practice BEFORE your hunt - film family events -



General Rule - Be on the same Plane as Subject **Intrigue** - Break the General rule **Sparingly** Film from Ground level Critique sound quality

Creating Outstanding Scenes:

Lighting is Everything - Turns ordinary film into Exceptional

Switch from Auto to Manual Modes

F- Stop / Controlled Exposure (shoot one F stop under) Shutter Speed Focus - Far Eye / Depth of Field

- Keep camera steady. Tripod (a MUST), Bi-Pod, Braced if hand held.)
- Keep camera readily available (strapped outside pack), etc.
- Try to keep clips short 15 seconds or less if possible. (Editing room will thank you.)
- Composition and Framing--(What objects are in your frame--where are they positioned?) Rule of thirds - Lead room - Head space _ 180o RULE
- Vary footage-----Panning (slowly), Zoom (slowly) - easily done with editing tools
