Legislative Team Update

Hello CBH/SAA friends and family!

The CBH/SAA Legislative Team is pleased to announce that we will again be sponsoring the **Annual Outdoor Sporting Caucus Trap Shoot** on Tuesday, June 21, 2022 at the Yolo Sportsman's Club. The Caucus Shoot is an event hosted by various sportsmen/women-focused non-profit organizations (NGOs) and Gaines and Associates in which our legislatures and their staff are invited to join us for an evening of skeet, trap and archery shooting. This is a great way to meet our representatives and educate them on our sport, the challenges we face, and to help them develop an appreciation for what we do.

As in past years, Robert Moore, John Waddles, and volunteer instructors from Maya Archers will run the archery booth. Joe Wylie tells me that the archery booth has been very well received with lots of legislatures and their staff partaking and shooting. THANK YOU, Team! We know that you will represent CBH/SAA well!

The CBH/SAA Legislative Team also submitted a comment letter to California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) regarding Fish and Game Commission (FGC) **Petition 2022-02 Heritage Deer Tag**. The letter outlined a few concerns including the petitions potential to divide the archery hunting community into smaller segments and pit them against each other for the limited number of tags available; be a slippery slope for further segmentation of other big game tags for other "special" reasons; and that it could inhibit the scientific and sound management of deer herds should too many hunters crowd into one area due to land closures or other reasons.

We asked that CDFW consider deer tag/validation options that would not impact the quantity and quality of existing hunts and to leverage the best available science related to deer populations and hunter reports on the success and quality of deer hunts in Zones A, B and D when making a recommendation to the Commission. Other Legislative Team actions and updates this month:

Participated in the Quarterly California Hunting and

 Conservation Coalition (CHCC) meeting on May 5, 2022. Robert Moore spoke to the group regarding the CalTIP program and the need for conservations groups to donate monies to the awards program. Options include a general donation to be used on any CalTIP case award or specific use such as a poaching case involving archery equipment. 4

- Participated in an in person/virtual meet and greet with new CDFW Deputy Director of the Wildlife and Fisheries Division, Chad Dibble on May 3, 2022. The meeting was generally positive. Chad appears committed to helping hunters and anglers stay relevant within the changing landscape of California's fish and wildlife management focus and strategies.
- Signed a coalition letter of support asking the California Law Revision Commission (CLRC) to terminate their decade long effort to reorganize the Fish and Game Code. The letter acknowledged that efforts to date have resulted in important reports on CDFW's mandates and funding, two bills to clean up the code, and a third bill is pending. Continued on page 5

Legislative Team Update From page 4- Further revisions could be counterproductive and cause confusion to citizens and agencies that use the code daily and hinder law enforcement efforts in the field. Therefore, it's time to allow CDFW staff to refocus on mission-specific tasks – including managing fish and game species to provide hunting and fishing opportunity. Gaines and Associates received several responses from letter recipients thanking us for weighing in and on May 11, 2022 the CLRC responded favorably and has agreed to terminate additional efforts!

- Started review of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Northwest California Integrated Resource Management Plan for public access, archery, and hunting-related issues. The plan will guide the BLM's management of approximately 382,000 acres of public land in Del Norte, Siskiyou, Shasta, Humboldt, Mendocino, Trinity, Tehama, and Butte counties for the next 15 to 20 years. This will replace the resource management plans the Redding and Arcata field offices put into place in the mid-1990s. You are welcome to comment as an independent citizen or share your thoughts with the CBH/SAA Legislative Team and we will draft a comment letter to the BLM, as needed. The deadline for comment to BLM is June 28.
- Signed coalition letters to the Governor and Senate and Assembly Budget Subcommittees requesting lawmakers insert a \$1 million augmentation for CDFW in the Fiscal Year 2022/2023 state budget to implement Fish and Game Code §1023 and §2000.6 – provisions placed in the code by SB 395 Wildlife Traffic Safety Act. These two code sections authorize CDFW to: develop a pilot state-of-the-art program using existing technology to collect and compile data on wildlife-vehicle collisions via the use of a smartphone app, which would allow motorists to report the real-time location and animal species of wildlife-vehicle collisions; and establish a pilot program for the issuance of wildlife salvage permits through that smartphone app to those desiring to salvage edible deer, elk, antelope, or wild pig killed as a result of a vehicle collision.
- Update on AB 1901 Dog Training Services and Facilities – legislation that would require dog trainers to disclose in writing certain information to a purchaser of dog training services including whether the trainer is licensed or certified by an animal training organization,

- training organization, the dog trainer's training philosophy, and any civil judgments related to the dog trainer's services. In response to opposition from our partners in the CHCC, the author eliminated all provisions of concern except one - AB 1901 states that a dog trainer shall deliver to a purchaser of training services a written disclosure stating, "whether the trainer is licensed or certified by any animal training organization." Although, this provision appears reasonable, it could be confusing and troublesome for trainers who specialize in sporting dogs. These trainers are not required to be licensed in California and although there are certifications for some types of training, there are not for others – including sporting dog training. Gaines and Associates thanked the author for the amendments, but the CHCC remains opposed to this legislation until the language of §122395.2 (a)(2) is amended to simply require trainers to disclose their "qualifications".
- Update on AB 1753 Fish and Wildlife: Poaching:
 Probation Periods legislation which would reinstate a maximum 3-year probation for four serious violations of the Fish and Game Code was referred to the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee but was held by the Chair and not heard. Having missed the April 29th deadline for fiscal bills to be heard in policy committee, AB 1753 is DEAD. CBH previously signed a coalition letter of support for this legislation.
- Update on SB 865 Junior Hunting License legislation which would raise the eligibility for a
 California junior hunting license from 15 years of age
 and under to 17 years of age and under passed out of
 the Senate Appropriations Committee on May 19 by a
 unanimous vote!! SB 865 also passed off the Senate
 Floor on May 27 by a unanimous vote. SB 865 is now in
 the Assembly pending referral to the Assembly policy
 committee. Continued on page 6



Continued from page 5 The bill will likely be referred to the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee where it must be heard and passed out to the Assembly fiscal committee by July 1 to meet legislative deadlines. This would be a great victory for continued R3 (Recruit, Retain, Reactivate) efforts!

- Update on SB 906 Firearms (School Disclosure) In direct response to our strong opposition, SB 906 was substantially amended, on April 6, 2022, to only require schools (grades 6 to 12) to send parents/guardians information related to the safe storage of firearms annually. Following these amendments showing up in print, we formally dropped our opposition to SB 906.
- Update on AB 1688 Firearms (Remove Microstamping) - AB 1688 was referred to the Assembly Public Safety Committee in February but was never heard. Having missed the April 29th deadline for fiscal bills to be heard in policy committee, AB 1688 is DEAD. This legislation would have eliminated the requirement that new handguns for sale in California be designed with microstamping components, thus allowing law-abiding California gun owners to have access the safest, most up-to-date firearm models.

CBH has a state recording of all big game species taken with a bow and arrow. Your harvest can be placed into the ranks of the record book if you meet the minimum scoring in inches as required. arrowed my first California deer and had it checked for minimum qualifications (scoring) at which point it would make the California state record book. This is where I was hooked. I went on to shoot more qualified animals that would be entered into the ranks of the CBH record book. I've taken Pacific Hybrid deer, Mule deer, Bear, Wild Boar, Antelope, Coyotes, and Bobcats. I have a Blacktail Deer species a Turkey species and Spanish Goat species. These all pertain to big game. In the off seasons I spent a lot of time hunting Coyotes with my bow and to date I now have 76.

After several successful years of bowhunting and many goals to reach, one was the prestigious Golden Eagle Award. This consists of 35 small game species taken with a bow in California. A friend of mine saw my album of hunting photos from the past to the present and noticed that I had a lot of small game species. He suggested that I should enter them into the CBH small game species recordings and receive a certificate. I told him I wasn't really interested in the small game entries. It came to mind that I already have a head start with many photos and a somewhat of a list started towards my 35 species. My earliest photo started with a Gopher in 1988. Now, this award has my attention, another goal! I was worried that I may not have all of my hunting licenses and fishing licenses needed to turn in my photos for the certificates. Here I am now in 2020 trying to find all or any of my past hunting licenses. I knew I never threw them away and that trying to locate the licenses for those years would be hard to find. My wife Pamela and I turn the house upside down checked every nook and cranny, drawer, and cupboard for as many licenses and tags any information that would help me put a number to the pictures. After our findings of several licenses, I was able to enter many species. From 2020 until the present, I have spent many days pursuing a list of small game species to meet my criteria of 35. I reached my small game goal with a Fox Squirrel at #35. Small game hunting can become addictive. Make a list of your targets and know if they are in capacity." Continued on page 11season and legal. I am currently working on #42.

The Double Eagle Award consist of 50 species. The Triple Eagle consist of 75 species. If you haven't tried hunting small game, it's never too late regardless of how old or young you are.

This article titled, Astronaut Joe Engle to Serve as Bear Archery Consultant, from Western Bowhunter Magazine (Image on page 11) September 1987, was under the title: Bowhunters News STATES, NATIONAL & INDUSTRY.

I remember talking to Joe at the Las Vegas shoot. We talked about bowhunting Whitetail deer. We were swapping bowhunting stories and I wasn't even thinking that he was an Astronaut and he didn't talk about himself being in the Air Force. So this Information will tell you about the bowhunter and Air Force General, Joe Engle and Astronaut Commander of space shuttle flights and his 20 years in the Air Force.

From Our Historian from page 9- "Engle who recently retired from NASA after 20 years as an astronaut, and from the US Air Force, is one of America's foremost test pilots and engineers. It was he who did the development flight aboard the first non-orbital space shuttle, Enterprise, at Edwards Air Force Base in California. He later served as commander of the second Space Shuttle mission aboard Columbia, as well as commander of a 1985 flight aboard Discovery. His flight aboard Discovery has been described by NASA as the most successful space shuttle mission ever flown. Engle, a native of Chapman, Kansas, graduate from the University of Kansas, with a degree in Aeronautical Engineering (1955). In 1964, he was voted one of the Ten Outstanding Young Men in America by the US Junior Chamber of Commerce and Outstanding Young Air Force Officer. He is only one of two astronauts to have come out of the high performance X-15 Research program at I didn't know at the time when I talk to Joe Engle Edwards Air Force Base. The other being Neil Armstrong, the first man on the moon. Engle made 16 flights in the X-15 program as a test pilot in the Fighter Test Group at Edwards. His boss during those days was General Chuck Yeager, the first man to break the sound barrier.

"Yeager has describe Engle as the best pilot in the world today. Engle has been a bowhunter since the 1960s, and was on the 1970 Bear Archery Astronaut Team that competed in the Cabo Hall Archery Tournament in Detroit. In 1972, he hunted with Fred Bear in Alaska and has been a frequent member of bowhunting camps since then.

"In making the announcement, Charlie Smith, who brought Engle into Bear Archery said, Joe Engles is one of America's foremost test engineers as attested to by the fact that the United States has entrusted him the responsibility on the leading edge of today's technology and has done so for more than 20 years. Joe has analyzed, proven and helped revise some of the leading engineering thoughts of the day. His experience in archery and bowhunting, while a relaxing pastime up until now, is sure to benefit all of our Bear and Jennings products because he is focused more, and down to earth. We are delighted that Joe will be working with us.

"Fred Bear also noted the appointment committing, 'Joe is going to be a very valuable addition to our Bear Jennings team. We know that his considerable knowledge of advanced materials will be a great benefit to all of us in Archery. But going beyond that, Joe also brings to us a fine reputation and a warm personality that all who meet him quickly comment upon. He is one of the finest people I've ever been in camp with. Engle is one of the 10 original members of the Fred Bear Sports Club, and a member of the society of experimental test pilots. He has won numerous awards from NASA, from engineering societies, the Air Force, including the AIAA Lawrence Sperry Award for Fights Research, the USAF Distinguished Flying Cross, the Department of Defense Distinguished Service Medal, the Robert H. Goddard Memorial Trophy, the Clifford B. Harman International trophy, the DAR Medal of Honor and the NASA Distinguished Service Medal. Joe and his wife, Mary, have two grown children, Laurie, a teacher, and Jon, an Air Force pilot of high performance aircraft. The Engles Currently reside outside the Johnson Space Center in Houston.'

Styles in Adult, Senior, Silver Senior & Master Senior: Compound Barebow (BB-C), Recurve Barebow (BB-R), Recurve Traditional, Bowhunter Freestyle (BHFS), Freestyle (FS), Freestyle Limited (FSL), Freestyle Limited Recurve (FSLR). Shoot from 60-50-40 yds except Recurve off the shelf which shoots from youth distances.
- 4. Recurve Off the Shelf (ROTS), LB/Wood & LB/Aluminum or Carbon arrows shoot at youth distances (50 40 30 yards). Only adult thru Master Senior may shoot this style.
- Styles in Young Adult, Youth & Cub: Barebow (Compound and Recurve BB compete with each other. Style is BB), Bowhunter Freestyle (BHFS), Freestyle (FS) & Freestyle Limited Recurve (FSLR). Cubs shoot from 30 - 20 –10 yards.
- 6. Style in Professional: Freestyle (FS). Professional Divisions include: Adult, Senior, Silver Senior & Master Senior.

All archers shoot 5 ends of 6 arrows at designated distances for their age group for a total score of 900.
