

Instructor's Training & Certification

Recently, Lodi Bowmen's Board approved the expansion of our archery school program to include four student instructors. These individuals will work with the existing instructor and their 4 students to develop practical, hands-on experience in the training of students from basic and intermediate levels. Upon completion of the approximately 40 hours of training, and passing the NFAA/USA Archery examination, they will be certified as a basic/intermediate instructor. The requirements are: must be at least 18 years of age, and must have either been an archer for 1 year OR have satisfactorily completed the Lodi Bowmen's Basic/Intermediate Archery School.

(ie. club, region, CBH, NFAA & USA Archery)
- B - Archery safety
- C - Steps to successful shooting - 11 steps
- D - Equipment; Genesis compound bows complete with sights, peeps & releases

- F - Putting together your own club program
- G - Student evaluations and techniques for testing proficiency
- H - Purchasing equipment
- I - Completing student profiles
